Old Fashioned Whoopie Pies

D-29 Adults (16 and over)

D-30 Youth

Submit one plate of 3 Whoopie Pies

WHOOPIE PIES

COOKIES:

1/2 cup shortening	1 tsp baking powder
1 cup sugar	1 tsp baking soda
1 egg	1 tsp salt
1/4 cup + 2 tablespoons cocoa	1 cup milk
2 cups all-purpose flour	1 tsp vanilla

FILLING:

1 cup shortening	1/3 tsp salt
1 cup confectioners' sugar	1 ½ tsp vanilla
1 1/3 cups Marshmallow Fluff or marshmallow creme	

COOKIES: In a large mixing bowl, cream together the shortening, sugar, and egg. In a separate bowl, whisk together the cocoa, flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Stir the vanilla into the milk.

Add the dry ingredients to the shortening mixture alternately with the milk/vanilla, beating until smooth. The dough will resemble thick cake batter. Drop the dough, by the tablespoonful, onto parchment-lined or lightly greased baking sheets, leaving about 2 inches between each cookie.

Bake the cookies in a preheated 350 degree F oven for about 15 minutes, or until they're firm to the touch, but not at all scorched-smelling. Remove the cookies from the oven and cool them completely on a wire rack.

PLEASE NOTE: Parental supervision is recommended when youth are using hot oven.

FILLING: Beat together the shortening, sugar and marshmallow, then stir in the salt and vanilla. Spread half of the cookies with a heaping 2 tablespoons of the filling (a cookie scoop works well for this): top with the remaining cookies. **HINT:** Use the filling to top half of the cookies without putting their tops on; that way you can see if the filling is evenly distributed. Yield: About 25 - 2 1/2-inch cookies, or 15 - 3 1/2-inch cookies.
